

Abstract Guidelines for the 19th DYMAT Technical Meeting

The abstract file is used to describe the contents of your paper. It should be sent to the 19 TM organizers by **15 May 2010**, together with the "Expression of Interest for a Poster Presentation" form which is available on the website. Please try to limit the size of your abstract file. If it is smaller than 1.5 Mb, you may be able to attach it to the abstract form; otherwise you should send it separately to the conference secretariat. Please use **MS Word or PDF** for your abstract file.

Your paper contents description should preferably contain **at least 500 words** and it is to be written in **English**. The final paper is also expected to be in English as well as your poster.

Your abstract file should allow the paper selection committee to verify whether or not it meets the objectives of the conference. You might consider adding one or two graphs to your abstract file in order to present more clearly the paper contents. You will be notified about the committee's decision by 30 June 2010.

We certainly hope that your abstract will be accepted. If this is the case, your paper is due by 15 October 2010. You may also want to check the important dates on the conference website.

Instructions on the paper format will be given later. The maximum paper length will typically be 7 to 8 pages.

The organizing committee would already like to thank you for your interest and your willingness for active participation. After all, the success of the conference mainly depends upon the quality of the presentations i.e. the quality of YOUR work.
